Knowing I would not be able to run TWC forever, I established the club as a 501c6 nonprofit with the hope that other women (with a similar vision and drive) could step up as President and continue to take the club to new heights. I knew I would only be able to step down once I felt confident the club would thrive without me.

Today, I'm so thankful that our club is at the peak of its health and success. Membership is up to nearly 150 members, we have strong leadership in place, healthy finances, and a fantastic line up of programs scheduled almost all the way through 2020!

Therefore, it's bittersweet for me to announce that the time has come for me to start winding down my role as President of The Walnut Club as I prepare to launch my next big venture. I am seeking out my replacement with the goal that she will take the reins by January 2020. (This opportunity is only available to current members.)

As you can imagine, passing my "baby" to someone else to lead definitely has me feeling a bit vulnerable. However, I am confident the next President will be able to take the club much farther than what I was capable of and, rest assured, I'm not going away! I will still be involved with the club, as I am excited to transition into a Board of Directors advisory role and still assist with our programming and partnership efforts.



For months, our Board and I have been working behind the scenes to figure out our next steps. We came up with a succession plan that we are confident will set up the next wave of leadership for success. We decided to amplify our leadership strength by adding new board positions, taking our board from five to eight people. We are also adding three new supporting roles: Membership Chair, Events Chair, and Sponsorship Chair. The Women of Walnut can be confident that their membership experience will not be affected during this transition in leadership.
